

Well-child exam

A well-child exam is a routine medical appointment aimed at monitoring your child's growth, development and overall health. Well-child exams are scheduled at regular intervals from infancy through adolescence. During these appointments, your healthcare providers will conduct physical examinations and developmental assessments, administer vaccinations, offer health education, and may recommend screening tests to ensure your child's well-being.

What if I have concerns not covered by a well-child exam?

If you'd like to discuss matters beyond the well-child exam, please be aware that your insurance may add additional fees, such as copays, coinsurance, or deductibles. These charges could apply to services related to current or chronic health issues.



For children 3 years and older: Some insurance companies require 365 days between well-child visits, while others are once per calendar year. Please check your plan information to verify.
